The Plan for the TY Career Programme 2024/25

Overall aim:

The aim of the 2024/2025 Career guidance and counselling programme for Transition Year students is to encourage students to reflect upon "knowing and caring for themselves" and to "begin exploring their career opportunities and options".

Overview of TY Year Plan

- Reflecting upon Personal strengths
- Aptitude and career interest inventories using Career Fit Testing (Tests academic strengths in Numeracy, literacy, and abstract reasoning)

- Discussing Career Opportunities which correlate to their aptitude and Interests via a Career Fit Report
- Reality testing these career opportunities through work experience on Wednesdays
- Exploring future career opportunities and options (Higher Education, tertiary degrees, PLC courses, apprenticeships etc) through Career Guidance classes rotated throughout the year
- Exploring access routes and financial supports which exist to promote inclusivity in accessing Higher Education in Ireland- through Career guidance classes rotated throughout the year
- Evaluating these career opportunities through a work experience diary and career investigation
- Correlating subject choice to each students' individual strengths and potential career opportunities via workshops, subject choice taster days and parent evenings held in February and March.

An Garda Síochána facilitates work experience where possible for Students during Transition Year at secondary level only.

Students interested in work experience should write to their local Chief Superintendent in the Division in which they live (contact local Garda Station for details).

The application should include a letter from the relevant school outlining that the student is insured. It should also outline the students name, address, date of birth and previous addresses. The dates of the proposed placement should be outlined and as much notice as possible should be given to arrange a placement.

Students should note that work experience will be in the administrative area and that it will not be possible to provide work experience in the operational Garda field.
